



*Mike Kulczycki enters* his third season as a member of the University of Michigan wrestling coaching staff. Prior to his appointment to the full-time coaching staff, Kulczycki spent a season as the Wolverines' strength and conditioning coordinator.

During Kulczycki's career at Michigan (2000-03), the Wolverines established themselves as a dominant team at the national level with top-10 showings at the NCAA Championships in each of his final three seasons. A 2001 All-American and four-time NCAA qualifier at 149 and 165 pounds, Kulczycki ranks among Michigan's most successful wrestlers with a 110-41 career record, placing him 16th on U-M's all-time wins list. Serving as team captain in his senior season, Kulczycki was also the 2003 recipient of the Steve Fraser Award for mental toughness.

Prior to his collegiate career, Kulczycki was a two-time Ohio state champion for St. Edward High School, earning outstanding wrestler honors at the 1998 Ohio state meet. He was a two-time Cadet world team member and claimed the Dave Schultz Award for Ohio following his senior campaign. A native of North Royalton, Ohio, Kulczycki graduated from Michigan in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in sports management and communications. He lives in Ann Arbor.
